Scoping: what is it?

Scoping sets the foundation or blueprint for the HIA, covering:

- The parameters of the assessment
- The management arrangements for the HIA

Scoping: why do it?

Scoping is important for:

- Governance and accountability of the HIA
- Scientific rigour and conduct of the HIA
- Management of the HIA

Scoping: when is it done?

After screening, if it has been decided to go ahead with an HIA

Scoping: drafting – who does it?

When introducing HIA

 Officers in the organisation

- As you gain experience in HIA and/or work in partnership
- Officers from other organisations may also be involved

Scoping: agreeing the scope – who does it?

- Steering Group for One or more officers support
- One or more
 officers support
 the Steering Group
 – those who
 screened the
 proposal, and
 those who will
 conduct the
 appraisal

Scoping: how is it done?

- Use a checklist
- Draft the scope
- Amend the draft and agree the scope

Scoping: what is it important to cover?

Governance and accountability issues

- Roles and responsibilities of the Steering Group
- Decision-making forum for the HIA results
- Ways of communicating the HIA results to stakeholders and others

Scoping: what is it important to cover?

Scientific rigour and conduct of the HIA

- Proposal analysis
- Aims and objectives of the HIA
- Values for the HIA
- Geographical area covered
- Community affected, including vulnerable groups
- Stakeholders for the HIA, and the nature of their involvement
- Methods of appraisal
- Information needed, e.g. research information and local data
- Potential health impacts of concern

Scoping: what is it important to cover?

Management of the HIA

- Work programme for the HIA
- Roles and responsibilities of officers involved in the assessment
- Arrangements for reporting to the Steering
 Group and decision-makers for the proposal
- Timescale for the HIA
- Resources needed for the HIA

What are the advantages of scoping?

- It provides a blueprint for everyone involved in the HIA to follow
- It increases the likelihood of undertaking the HIA successfully in terms of the outputs required
- It provides a framework for the scrutiny of the HIA
- It provides a basis for governance and accountability for the HIA
